



## **NEW COURSES AND METHODOLOGIES AT THE CENTRE FOR EDUCATION AND TRAINING**

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## **ABOUT THE CENTRE**

Established in early 1970, the Centre is now not only conducting training for Indonesian diplomats, but also foreign diplomats as well as non-diplomatic personnel in the field of administrative and communication, to be sent as home staff at Indonesian missions abroad.

From time to time, the Centre added new courses and improve new methodologies in the view of improving the professionalism of diplomacy actors and the capacity of other non-diplomat personnel.

### Activities: Junior Diplomatic Training



- Once a year, 7 months + 3 months internship
- Participants: newly recruited officer having various education background



### Activities: Mid-Career Diplomatic Training



- Twice a year (March and August)
- Requirements: Participants' diplomatic rank minimum Second Secretary, being posted abroad once, and 7 years of service
- Selection process: language proficiency test (TOEFL score 525), essay writing, paper presentation





- Attended also by diplomats from Asian and African countries

### Activities: Senior Diplomatic Training

- Twice a year (March and August)
- Requirements: Participants' diplomatic rank minimum Counselor, having experience of at least 12 years of service
- Selection process: language proficiency test (TOEFL score 550), essay writing, paper presentation





- Attended also by senior diplomats from ASEAN+3 countries

### **New Training Methodologies**

- Mixing retired ambassadors, academics, and active MFA officers to take part in a simulation exercise. Retired ambassadors will use the approach of what we call “when I was”, academics will use theoretical approach, and active MFA officers will impart their recent experience in negotiating national interest.
- Putting together in one place junior, mid-career, and senior diplomats. Each level will be asked to demonstrate their task such as: junior diplomats will have to make a report, mid-career diplomats will have to provide information and factual needed, and the senior diplomats will be asked to represent and do the decision making related to national interest before an international forum or conference.
